## **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

The Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. School of Education offers a Master of Science in Inclusive Adolescence Education. The program is designed for candidates who have a bachelor's degree and seek dual initial certification in adolescence education (grades 5-12) and students with disabilities as a generalist.

Certification is available in the following content areas:

- Biology
- Mathematics
- Chemistry • Physics
- Earth Science • Social Studies
  - Spanish
- English • French
- The curriculum is 42 credit hours and can be completed in five semesters. The program is offered in a combination of hybrid and online classes. Included in the program are 150 hours of clinical experience and 14 weeks of student teaching. Clinical experiences and student teaching are completed during the day.

## ACCREDITATION

The Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. School of Education is accredited based on the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) Standards through 2026.

Formerly the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), CAEP is the sole nationally recognized accrediting body for educator preparation, and is recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation.

- Applicants must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 for baccalaureate degrees from approved postsecondary institutions.
