Students seeking Inclusive Childhood Education certification (Grades 1-6) <u>without</u> Middle School Extension must major in Inclusive Childhood Education and another approved liberal arts major or concentration: Communication, Interactive Media, Computer Science, Economics, English Literature or Writing, Sport Management, History, Psychology, Mathematics, French or Spanish, American Studies, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Sociology. The second major or concentration may require candidates to complete more than the minimum 120 credits required for degree completion. Students are highly recommended to contact the Office of Transfer Admissions to discuss options and advising in more detail.
