## Mohawk Valley Community College Courses:

**Recommended:** Fulfill remainder of associate degree requirements. Choose courses from major listing below to fulfill major elective requirements for your program of choice.

American Studies - BA	Choose courses from the following: BM 110 or 115; PS 101; HI 101 or 102, 111, 112; 214
Anthropology - BA	Choose Anthropology courses
Biology – BA/BS	BI 141, 142; CH 141, 142; MA 110
Chemistry - BA/BS	CH 141, 142, 247, 248; PH 151 & 152
Cybersecurity – BS	CI 245, 230, 271 or IS 210, CI 272 or IS 220
Economics – BA	BM 110, 115; MA 110
English – BA Literature or Writing concentration	<b>Literature Concentration:</b> Choose three courses from: EN 248, 249, 271, 280; Choose EN 255 or 256; and one course from 200 level EN. <b>Writing Concentration:</b> EN 197 and one ENG literature course at the 200 level and one EN course at the 200 level.
History – BA	Choose up to five courses from the following: HI 101, 102, 111, 112,, 214 and other HI courses.
International Studies – BA	BM 110; HI 102; PS 205; Spanish language proficiency through the intermediate level in order to start at 200 level at Fisher.
Legal Studies – BA	Contact Fisher admissions counselor for advisement
Mathematics – BA/BS	MA 151, 152, 253, 275
Modern Language – BA	SP 101, 102, 202; One course in another language.
Philosophy - BA	Choose Philosophy courses
Physics – BA	MA 151, 152; PH 151 & 152
Physics – BS	MA 151, 152; ; PH 151 & 152
Political Science – BA	PS 101, 202, 205
Psychology – BA/BS	PY 101, 201, 203, 204, 202 or 207, 213. One PHL and one Natural Science course each.
Religious Studies – BA	PHL 109; Any credit bearing courses of student’s interest/choice.
Sociology – BA	SOC 101 - 104
Statistics – BA	MA 151, 152; CI 271 or IS 210

BA degree candidates need to show **language proficiency**. Students can fulfill the requirement by either having transfer credit for language at the 112 level at Fisher (102 level at cc), taking course(s) at Fisher to complete at the 112 level or by taking a language proficiency test through the department of Modern Languages at Fisher that demonstrates proficiency at the 112 level. The proficiency test does not result in academic credit, as this is not a credit requirement. Transfer coursework will result in academic credit.

Grade Point Average: 2.0 GPA required for admission consideration to St. John Fisher. Student must submit formal transfer application available at <http://go.sjf.edu/transfer> the semester before intended enrollment.
