Abstract	This collection measures 31.85 cubic feet and documents the activities of Theodore C. Cazeau and his involvement with the Grand Army of the Republic and later, the Sons of Union Veterans organizations, for which he was elected national commander-in-chief in 1929. The collection, which spans the years 1863 to 1935, includes correspondence, photographic material, printed material, manuscripts, clippings, textiles, and artifacts.

Biographical Note

Theodore Charles Cazeau (1875-1934) was born in Rochester to Ella and Theodore H. Cazeau, a Civil War veteran whose stories from his service in the NY 8th Calvary Regiment piqued the interest of young Theodore and spurred a life devoted to remembering the sacrifices of area soldiers who fought for the Union. After graduating from the Rochester Free Academy, Cazeau became the confidential secretary to Captain Henry Lomb. Cazeau was appointed vice chairman of the Memorial Day Flower Committee, which was responsible for placing flowers on the grave of every soldier in Monroe County. Thus began Cazeau's lifelong effort to document not only the gravesites of the soldiers and the lives of the surviving veterans, but to also record the details of their service. An insurance man by day, Cazeau devoted an enormous amount of his money and time to the continued recognition of these men, eventually helping to organize and becoming the commander of the Captain Henry Lomb Camp. In 1918, he was elected the commander of the State of New York Sons of Union Veterans, and in 1929 was made the commander of the national Sons of Union Veterans (SUV), an organization that served as an extension of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR), a fraternal group for veterans of the Civil War. His community involvement extended to the Monroe Commandery of Knights Templar and the Lions Club, for which he served as president. Cazeau also served as president of the SUV's National Patriotic Instructors' Association, and the GAR's Eighth New York Calvary Association. During his tenure as the president of the Standard Bearers' Association, Cazeau was instrumental in establishing the Transfer of the Flags ceremonies in Rochester-area schools, and led a yearly trip--at his own expense--wherein he accompanied a group of young standard bearers to Gettysburg, where his own father had fought and been wounded. Cazeau's passion culminated in his success in bringing the national GAR encampment to Rochester in 1934. The rigors of his efforts may have precipitated his death later that year when he succumbed to a streptococcal infection. Theodore C. Cazeau died at age 59, leaving behind wife Genevieve Hart Cazeau, and two daughters, Genevieve and Hortense.

Scope and Contents Note

The Theodore C. Cazeau Grand Army of the Republic Collection comprises correspondence, subject files, graphic material, textiles, and artifacts documenting Cazeau's involvement with the Grand Army of the Republic and its successor organization, the Sons of Union Veterans. Of special note are the local Civil War soldier service documents and record books, which record important biographical information of soldiers from local regimental companies. Also to be noted are the record books of various GAR and SUV camps and posts, which document the activities of these organizations. The collection also features a wide array of encampment and reunion ribbons and medals.

Custodial History

The custodial history is largely unknown. According to an article in the March 5, 1979, issue of the Rochester (N.Y.) Times-Union, the collection passed to a relative upon Cazeau's death in 1934. Prior to that relative's death, John Westerberg of the Yankee Peddler Bookshop was summoned to the house to collect the materials, which he sold to Bob Gullo, director of Lavery Library.

Processing Information

Processed by consulting archivist Cheri Crist, May 2014. This project was made possible by a grant from the Documentary Heritage Program of the New York State Archives, a program of the State Education Department. The provenance of this collection was compromised by the integration of general GAR-related materials oer the years. Previous attempts to organize some of Cazeau's material are evident; however, these attempts further disrupted the original order and provenance of the collection. Every attempt was made to segregate materials from the Cazeau collection from the general GAR collection. Where original order was evident--Cazeau organized one box of correspondence by state, and some materials were found in folders with subjects provided by Cazeau--this order was maintained. Loose material was integrated into the existing order as appropriate.

A large amount of newspaper clippings dating from the 1920s and 1930s were reformatted onto acid-free paper. Other fragile items, such as telegrams, letters, and manuscript materials, that were in danger of becoming illegible due to fading and general deterioration, were also reformatted. Nine photographs were identified and recommended for conservation. Issues of The Banner (1929-1934) should be digitized due to their brittleness.

Series Description

Hard, Henry Lilly, Henry Lomb, and Samuel C. Pierce are included.
